

- One of 15 National Trails in UK
- Funded by Central Govt
- 154 miles long
 Mainline via Folkestone
 Canterbury Loop Pilgrims Way & Via Francigena
- Surrey Hills & Kent Downs AONBs
- Key Characteristics: Ancient Woodland/ Viewpoints/ Chalk downland & Coastal - orchids, bees & butterflies
- Military Heritage pill boxes, gun batteries &, fortifications & castles
- Connectivity
 – domestic rail & motorway network
- London & Gateway to Europe overseas visitors







- Make the case for funding bids





- Create new business opportunities for our Ambassadors






What we're looking for

Hazard identification



People: Who, what do they do, any hazardous work or environment, specialist skills needed

Equipment: Fixed and portable machinery, personal

protective equipment, hand tools, vehicles etc.

Materials: Raw materials, chemicals, packaging

Environment: Buildings & premises, biological hazards, urban

or rural, weather, heat/light, dust

 What risks do these pose, how, and what control strategies are in place?





Human factors in safety



Lapses in Concentration

Proper and safe course of action chosen but a slip occurs in performing it.

Misperceptions

Decisions based on information, but not all relevant information is there. Information is ignored which doesn't fit in with their previous experience.

Mistaken Actions


Doing the wrong thing under the impression that it is correct.

Mistaken Priorities


Conflict between output and safety measures.

Wilfulness

Wilfully disregarding safety – a rare cause of accidents. Fine line between 'mistaken priorities' and 'wilfulness'.




