**Public WCs and other WCs located in businesses and premises along Hadrian's Wall Path.**

**Please note that, unless otherwise stated, the following pubs, cafés, Roman Wall sites, businesses and other organisations provide WCs for their paying customers only and in any case during normal opening hours**

Tyneside - Hadrian's Way section of Trail

Segedunum Roman fort and Museum

Newcastle quayside – where you will find cafés and restaurants. On the opposite side of the river, across the Gateshead Millennium bridge, there are WCs in the Baltic Mill Centre for Contemporary Art and the Sage Gateshead.

Newburn sports centre

Newburn country park – former visitor centre, now a privately run café.

Northumberland

Heddon-on-the Wall – Shell garage

Whittledene reservoirs – (southern reservoirs) permissive WC, part of fishing club facilities, courtesy of Northumbria Water. Grid Ref: NZ065680.

Robin Hood Inn – B6318

Vallum café – B6318

Errington Arms pub & restaurant – A68 / B6318 junction

Riverside tea room - Chollerford

Chesters Roman fort - Chollerford (English Heritage)

Housesteads Roman Fort – National Trust visitor centre in car park.

Twice Brewed Inn – approx half a mile south of the Trail

Cawfields quarry car park – National Park WC

Walltown quarry car park – National Park WC

Lanercost tea room and restaurant (½ mile south of Trail)

Reading Room café in Walton

Sands Centre – Carlisle

The Highland Lassie Inn – Glasson

The Drover's Rest – half a mile south of Beaumont village

The Hope and Anchor Inn – Port Carlisle

The King's Arms Inn – Bowness-on-Solway

Lindow (village) hall - Bowness-on-Solway
